Sabina (Juniperus phoenicea turbinata)

Habitat: sandy soils, dunes. This is a protected species in Andalusia.

Its leaves are scale-shaped, overlapping one another thus differentiating it from Juniperus macrocarpa. The scales are generally arranged in rows of four.

Harvesting the berries depends on the dune environment; as they do not all ripen at the same time. The technique is: slide your hand along the branch, from inside the bush outwards, taking the berries with you.
