Wild Carnation (Dianthus malacitanus)

This is a dynamic and perennial plant. It lives in coastal areas, in thick bunches on stony and limestone soils. It can even be found under juniper bushes and in clearings in pine forests or other forests of other trees.

At the moment, the species only exists in the "Dunas de Artola" Natural Monument.

It is a hardy plant and blooms until the end of August, the flowers very rarely lasting until September.

These are hermaphroditic. The corolla can usually be either pale pink or white.

It is a Protected Species and is included in the "Vulnerable" category.
