But that's not all! The most intrepid took on an extra mission: harvesting the juniper berries at their peak ripeness. This is a more complex task than it seems, as some of the *Juniperus macrocarpa* bushes had berries in three different states: unripe, ripe, and perfectly ripe. This turned out to be an exercise in observation and skill, as juniper leaves are spikey!

Thanks to everyone who took part - today Europe and Marbella are a little cleaner.
